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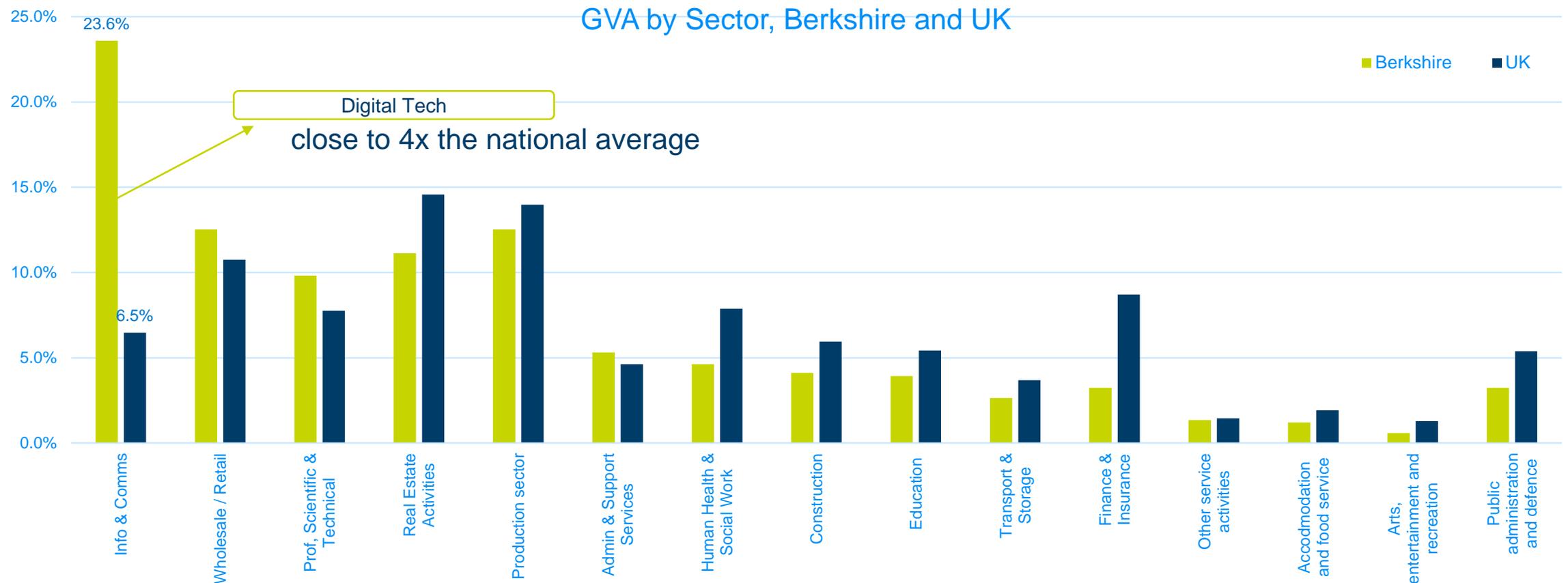


# Introduction

- Berkshire, situated in the South-East Golden Triangle of Oxford, Cambridge and London is home to nearly 8,000 tech companies and over 50,000 tech specialists. In 2022 their combined turnover was £14bn with 14% of all jobs within this sector, which is three times the national average.
- Berkshire is the base for many multi-national digital businesses including Microsoft, Vodafone, Oracle and Thales. Reading is ranked first in the UK for the number of Digital technology related Head Quarters.
- The presence of global leaders, innovators, strong networks, academic excellence and talent, along with outstanding locational advantages, presents a compelling proposition. This Berkshire Digital Technology Proposal details the significance of this industry sector not just to Berkshire but to the UK economy as well.



# Berkshire enterprises generated Gross Value Added (GVA) of £43.39bn in 2020: almost a quarter (23.6%) of this GVA was generated by the Digital Tech (Info & Comms) sector – close to 4x the national average – demonstrating the clear strength of the Berkshire LEP area in the Digital Tech sector.

# Berkshire continues to attract significant digital tech related foreign direct investment (FDI). Reading ranks first in the UK for the number of foreign HQs and boasts the UK headquarters of Microsoft, Oracle, Veritas, Huawei and Thales Group.

In 2021/22, Berkshire received significant inward investment in digital tech with nine successful 'Software and computer services' projects and five in the 'Electronics and communications' category

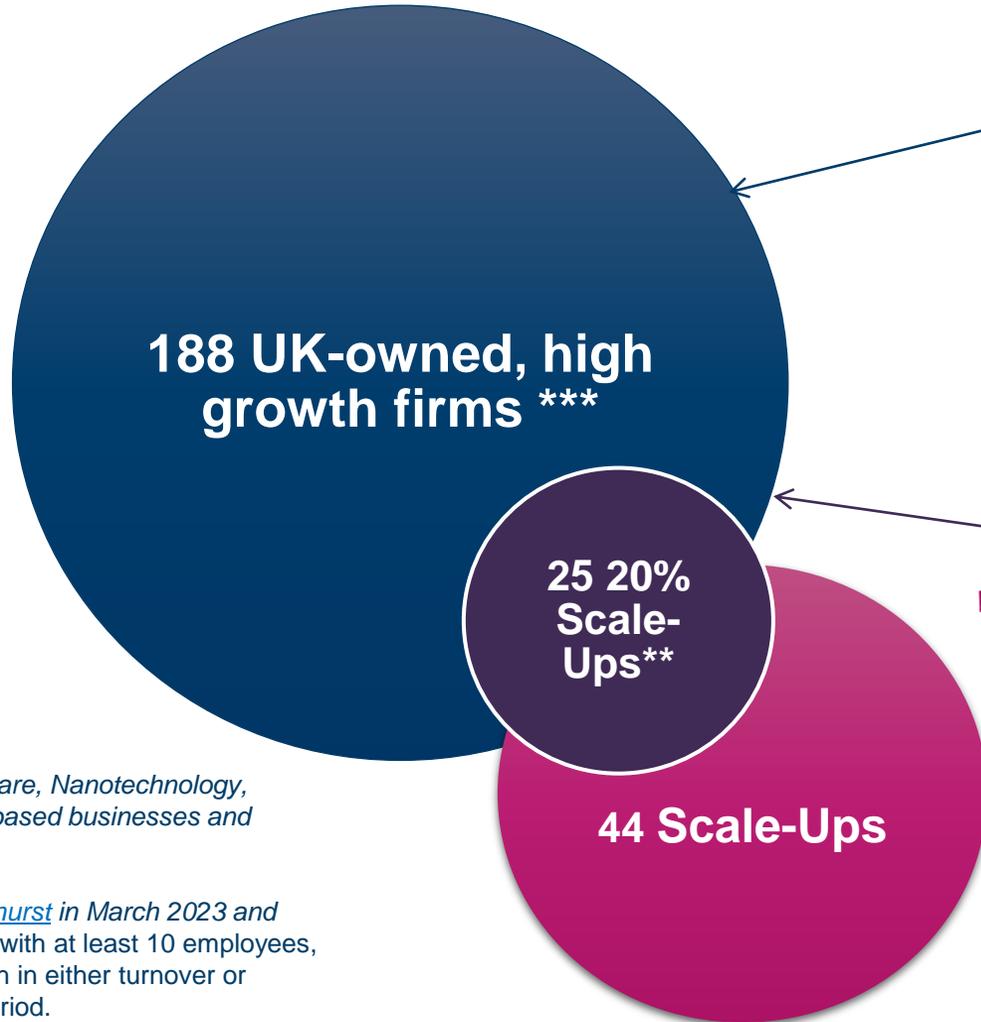

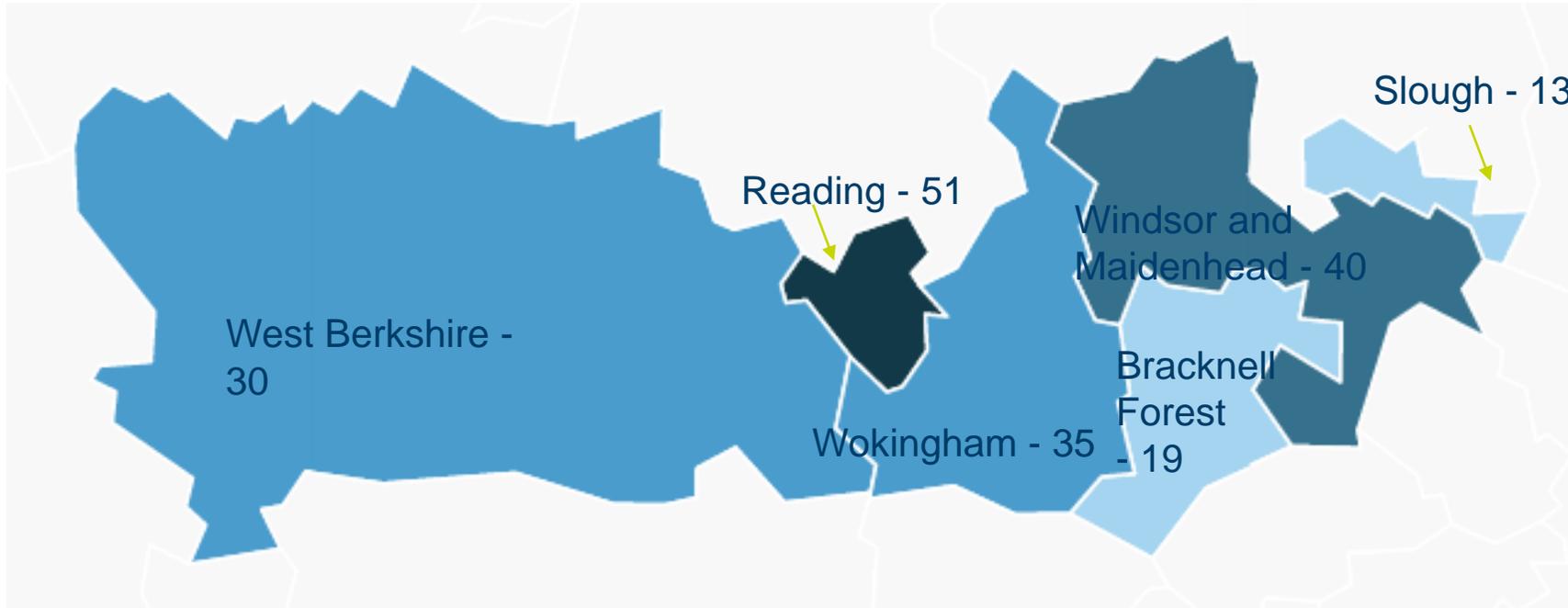

## Institute of Technology (IoT)

A new IoT is located at Bletchley Park with two additional hubs in Oxford and Reading (Reading College) following a £28 million grant from the Department of Education; providing a thousand students a year with an inclusive centre for technical qualifications, higher apprenticeships and training which will be vital in bridging the shortage in digital skills and Fintech sector across the nation.

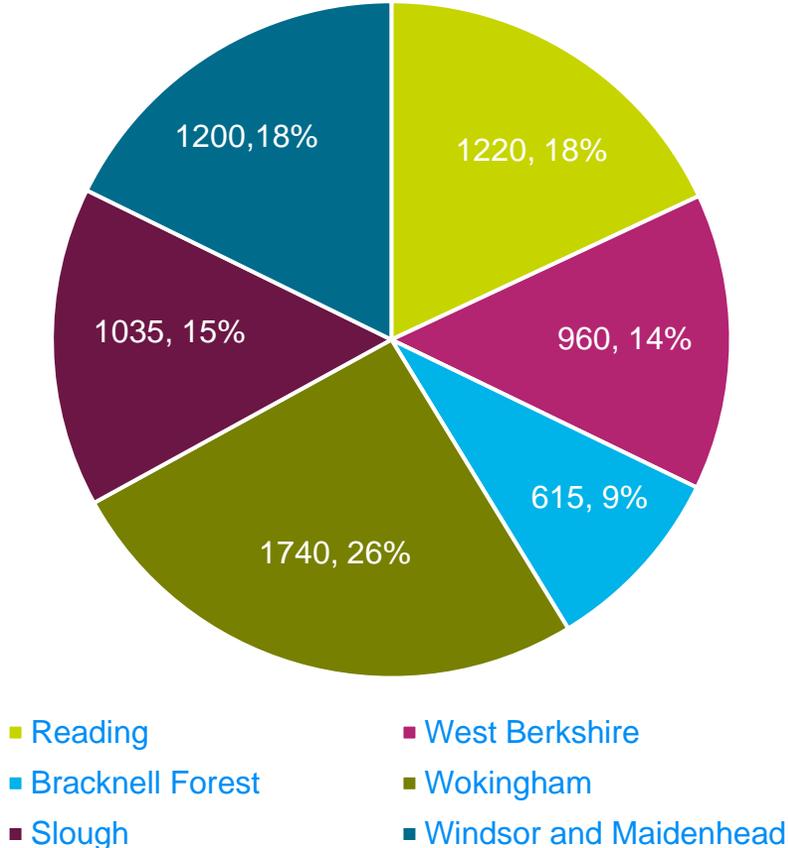

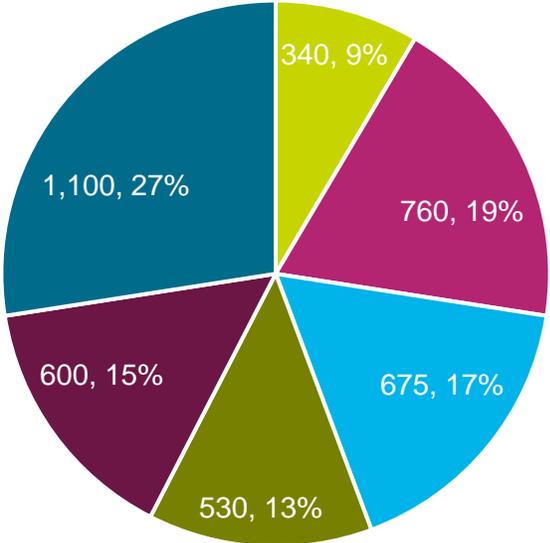

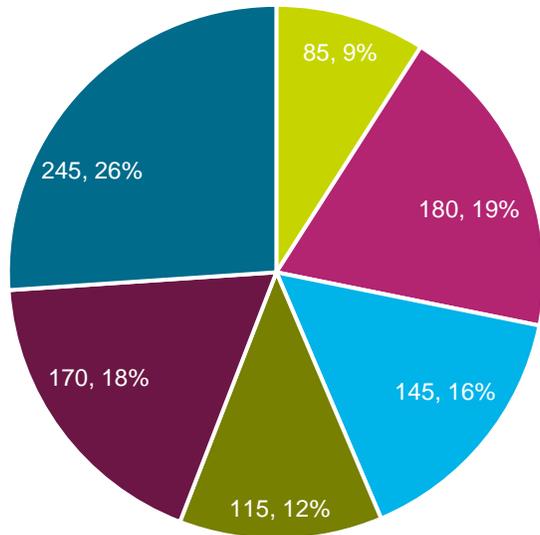

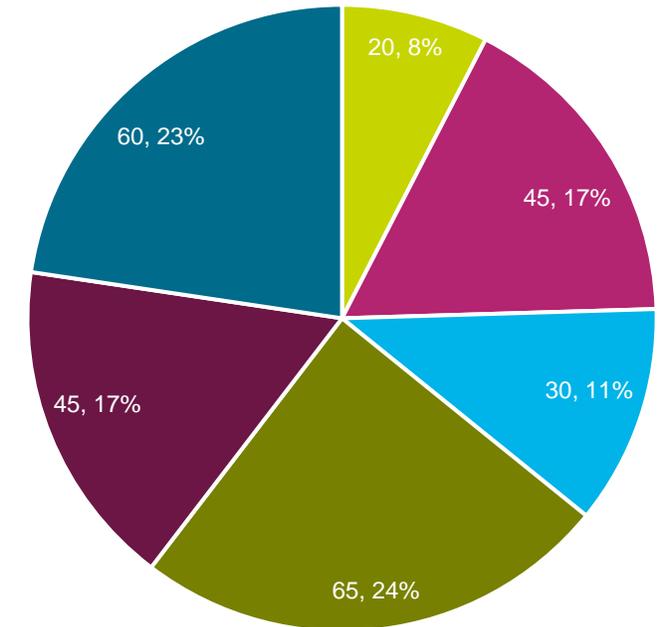

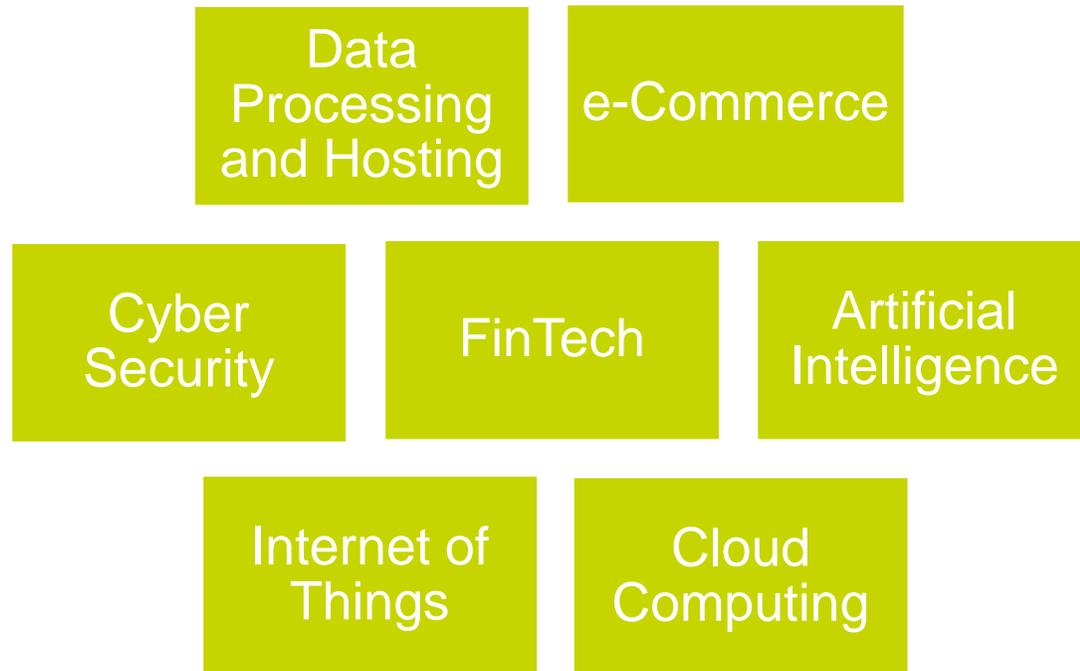

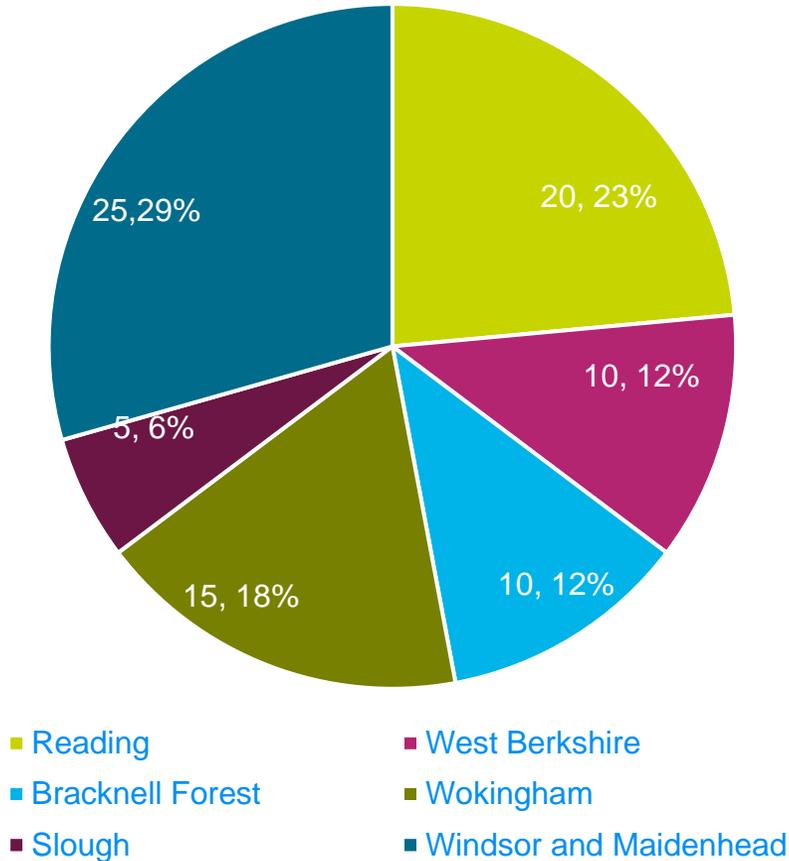


# High growth Digital Tech sectors represented in Berkshire

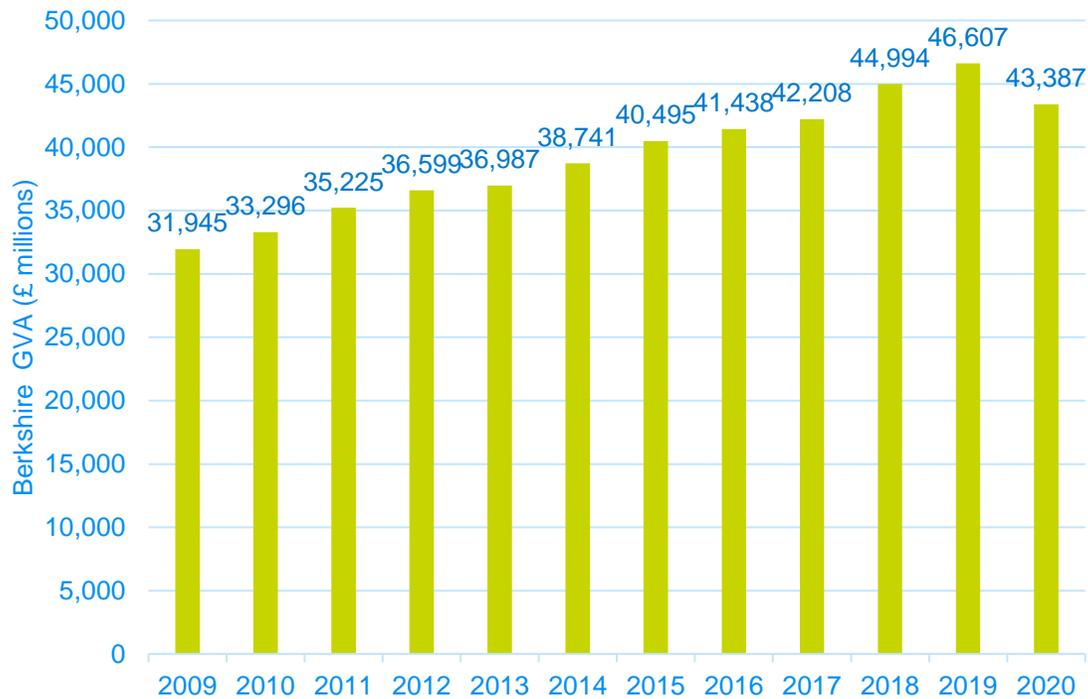

(chained value measures, 2019 prices)

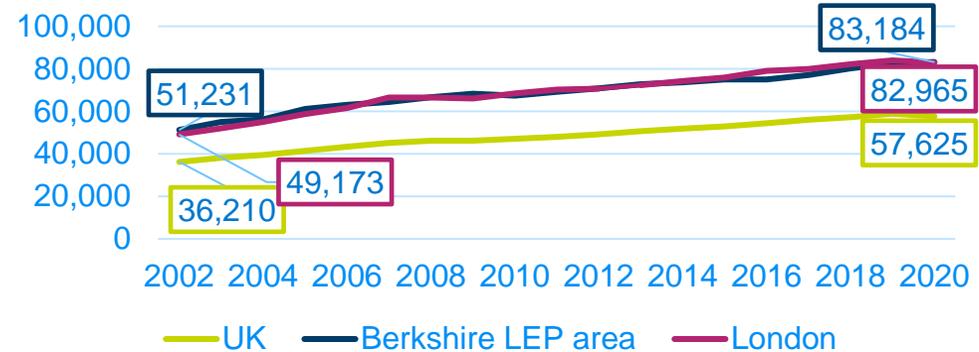

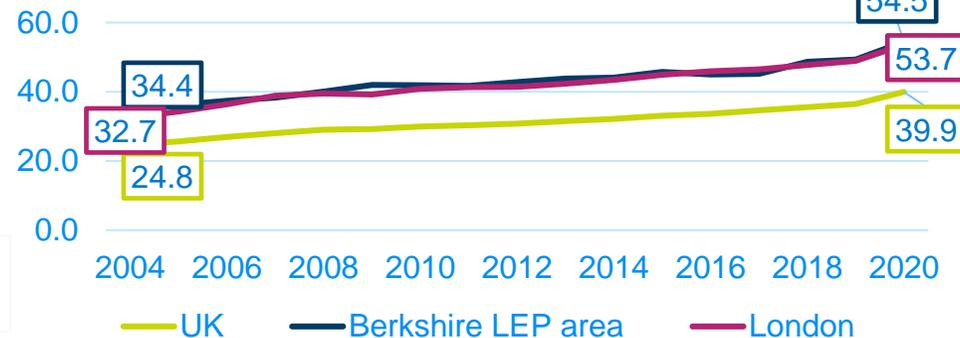

Nominal (unsmoothed) GVA per hour worked (£'s)

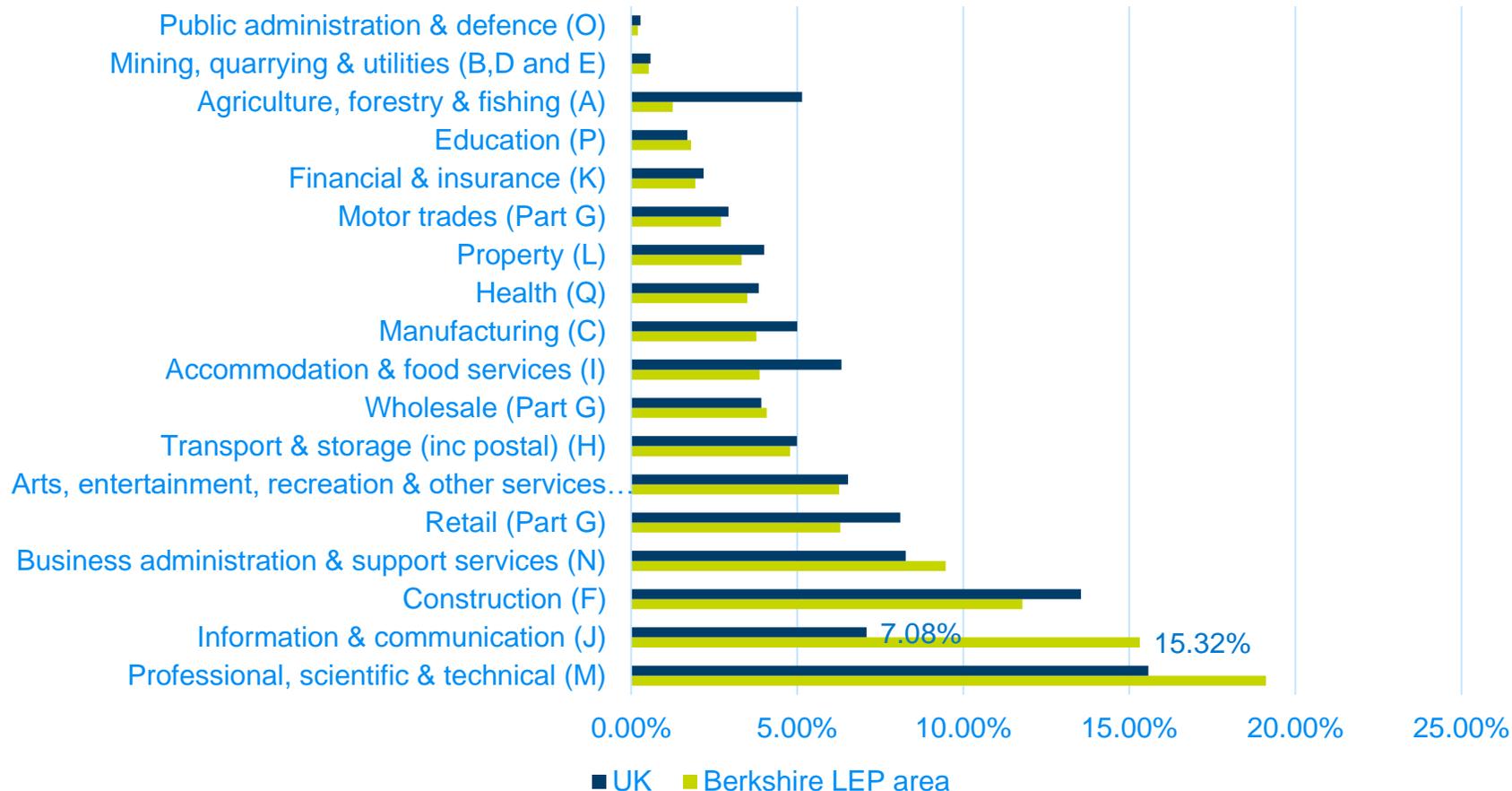

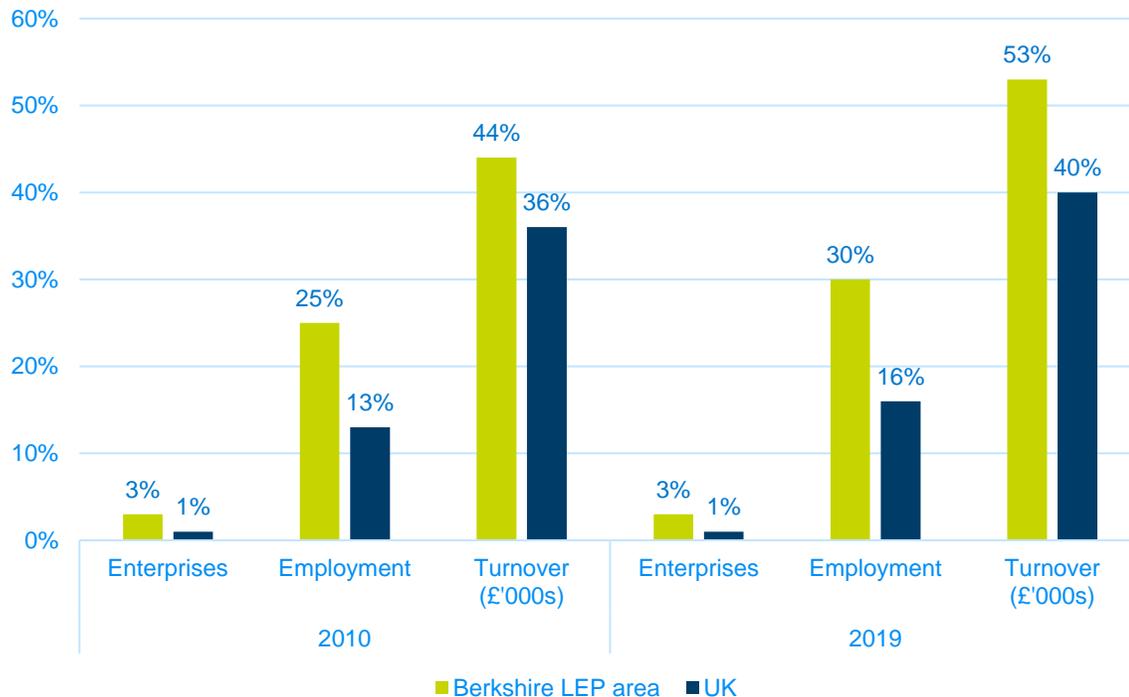

## Foreign-Owned Companies: contribution to employment and turnover



According to the latest available ONS data from 2020, Berkshire has the highest concentration of Foreign-Owned Companies of all LEP areas.

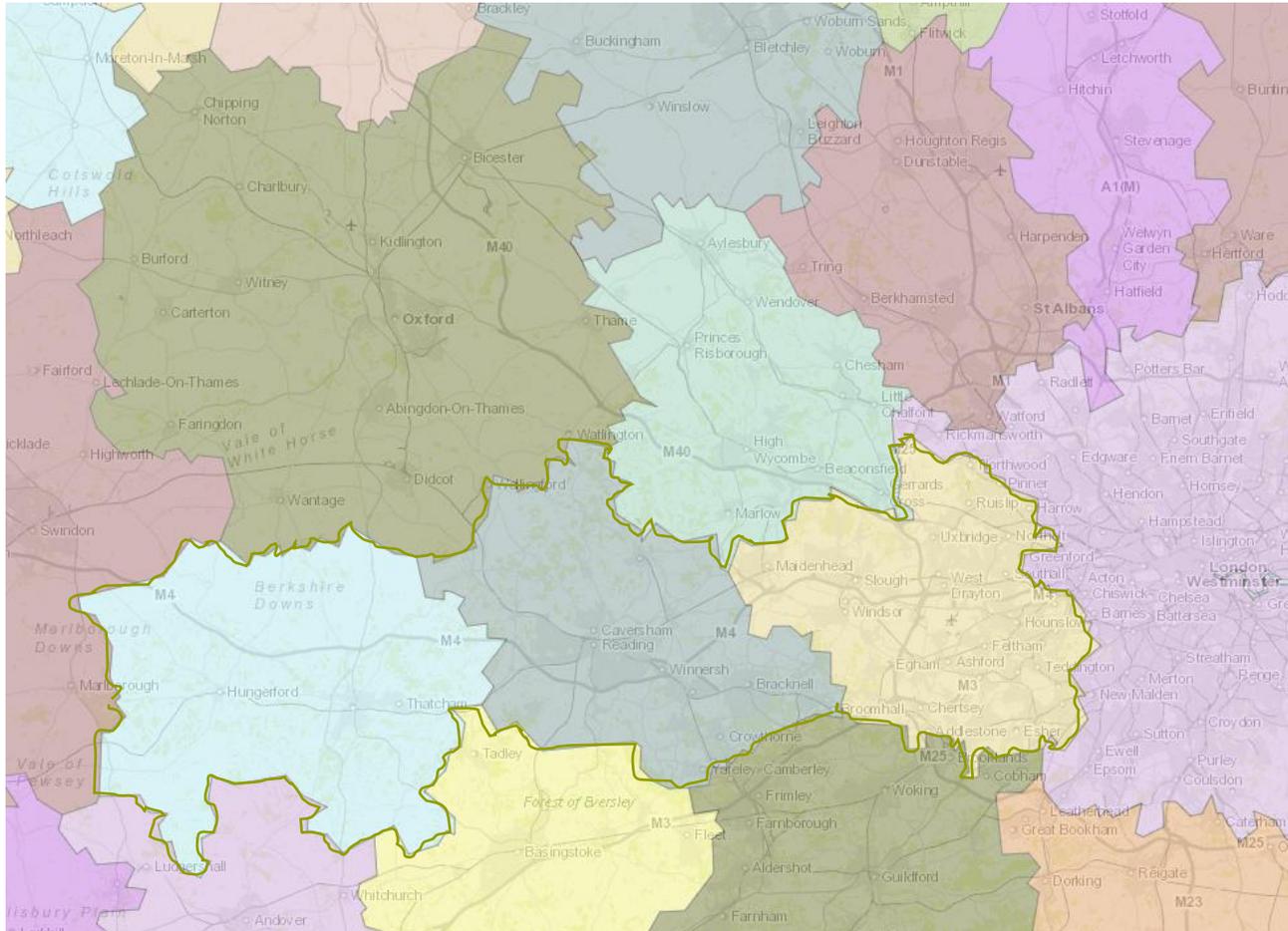
Berkshire has achieved strong Foreign Direct Investment figures in recent years, leading to an increase in the number of Foreign-Owned Companies, from 945 in 2010 to 1,295 in 2019.

Whilst Berkshire's Foreign-Owned Companies only represented 3% of all local businesses in 2019, they generated 30% of local employment and 53% of local turnover.

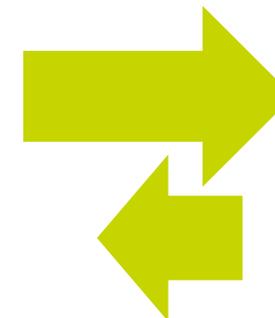
Since 2010, the proportion of local jobs in Foreign-Owned Companies has increased from 25% to 30%. Slough has the greatest proportion of employment in EU owned firms and Bracknell in 'rest of the world' owned firms.
